attachmentProxy-class *'attachmentProxy'*: a class representing a proxy to an attachment file in FlowRepository

Description

This class represents basic metadata (i.e., information about) a single attachment file in FlowRepository.

Details

Objects of class attachmentProxy are used to hold information about a FlowRepository attachment file. This information includes the file name, URL, size in bytes, MD5 sum, description and a path to the file on the local file system. A NULL value in the localpath slot indicates that the attachment file has not been downloaded, you can use the [download](#) method to download the file.

Creating Objects

Objects of the attachmentProxy class are created automatically when you create a flowRepData object from FlowRepository by calling the [flowRep.get](#). A list of attachmentProxy objects will be placed in the attachments slot of the flowRepData object.

Unless you know what you are doing, creating objects using new or the constructor (as described below) is discouraged.

name: Object of class character containing the name of the FlowRepository attachment file.

url: Object of class character containing the url of the FlowRepository attachment file.

md5sum: Object of class character or NULL containing the MD5 sum of the FlowRepository attachment file.

description: Object of class character or NULL containing the description of the FlowRepository attachment file.

localpath: Object of class character or NULL containing the path the FlowRepository attachment file as saved on the local file system. This slot is used to determine whether the file has been downloaded to the local file system. A value of NULL indicates that the attachment file has not been downloaded. The [download](#) method can be used to download the file.

download

Download dataset files

Description

This method can download whole datasets (all FCS files and attachments of a [flowRepData](#) object) or individual files based on file proxies ([fileProxy](#) objects).

Usage

```
download(object, ...)
```

Arguments

`object` Object of class [fileProxy](#) or [flowRepData](#).
`...` Additional options, see the details section.

Details

The full dataset or the file represented by the file proxy will be downloaded to the local file system. If you are downloading the whole dataset (passing a [flowRepData](#) object), then you can specify the following additional options:

`dirpath=NULL` The path to the directory where to download the files. By default, the files will be downloaded to a folder named based on the dataset identifier (FR-FCM-xxxx) that will be created in your working directory.

`use.credentials=TRUE` Whether to use stored credentials to login before downloading the dataset. Credentials will only be used if `use.credentials=TRUE` and they are set (see [setFlowRepositoryCredentials](#)). If your credentials are set, but you are downloading a public dataset that does not need credentials, then you can use `use.credentials=FALSE` to avoid logging in.

`show.progress=TRUE` Whether to show progress as individual files are being downloaded.

If you are downloading a single file by (passing a `fileProxy` object), then you can specify the following additional options:

`dirpath=NULL` The path to the directory where to download the file. By default, the file will be downloaded to your working directory. A `filepath` argument as specified below takes precedence over the `dirpath` argument.

`filepath=NULL` The path where to download the file. If provided, this argument takes precedence over `dirpath`.

`curlHandle=getCurlHandle(cookiefile="")` Used to pass cookies to keep track of sessions. This is intended for internal use, not to be used by regular users.

`show.progress=TRUE` Whether to show progress as the file is being downloaded.

Value

A `fileProxy` object if object is a `fileProxy` object or a `flowRepData` object if object is a `flowRepData` object. This is an updated file proxy or a dataset that includes local path to the downloaded files.

Description

This class represents basic metadata (i.e., information about) a single FCS file in FlowRepository.

Details

Objects of class `fcsProxy` are used to hold information about a FlowRepository FCS file. This information includes the file name, URL, size in bytes, MD5 sum, FCS version and a path to the file on the local file system. A NULL value in the `localpath` slot indicates that the FCS file has not been downloaded, you can use the [download](#) method to download the file.

Creating Objects

Objects of the `fcsProxy` class are created automatically when you create a `flowRepData` object from FlowRepository by calling the `flowRep.get`. A list of `fcsProxy` objects will be placed in the `fcs.files` slot of the `flowRepData` object.

Description

This class represents basic metadata (i.e., information about) a single file in FlowRepository.

Details

Objects of class fileProxy are used to hold information about a FlowRepository file. This is a common parent class for [fcsProxy](#) and [attachmentProxy](#) classes, which hold information about an FCS file and about an attachment, respectively. Direct instances of the fileProxy are not expected.

Creating Objects

The fileProxy class is used as a common parent for [fcsProxy](#) and [attachmentProxy](#) classes. Objects of the fileProxy class shall not be created directly, unless you know exactly what you are doing.

There is no constructor defined, but objects can be created using

flowRep.get

Retrieve information about a specified FlowRepository dataset.

Description

This function connects to FlowRepository (flowrepository.org) via an XML-based API and retrieves metadata about a specified dataset in the form of a [flowRepData](#) object.

Usage

```
flowRep.get(id, use.credentials=TRUE)
```

Arguments

id An identifier of a FlowRepository dataset. List of available datasets can be obtained by calling the [flowRep.ls](#) function.

use.credentials

Whether to use your credentials (email and password) to access FlowRepository. Your credentials can only be used if previously set by calling the [setFlowRepositoryCredentials](#), function. Otherwise, this parameter will be ignored. Using credentials will allow you to access private datasets that are either yours or that have been shared with you. Without credentials, you will have access to public datasets only. If you are accessing a public dataset and you have stored your credentials, then setting `use.credentials=FALSE` will skip authentication (login/logout) and therefore perform a little bit faster.

Details

An HTTP GET request retrieves an XML from FlowRepository, and this XML is parsed to extract metadata about the specified experiment (i.e., dataset).

Value

A `flowRepData` object as long as referenced dataset is found in FlowRepository and the user has access to it. An error is thrown otherwise.

Description

This function connects to FlowRepository (flowrepository.org) via an XML-based API and retrieves a vector of identifiers of available datasets.

Usage

Arguments

`include.private`

Whether to include private experiments in the list. This only works if credentials to access FlowRepository have been provided. By default, only public experiments will be listed.

An HTTP GET request retrieves an XML from FlowRepository, and this XML is parsed to extract the list of identifiers of public experiments.

Value

A vector of objects of class character containing strings with FlowRepository dataset identifiers available.

Description

This function connects to FlowRepository (flowrepository.org) via an XML-based API and searches for datasets matching the query term. The search covers experiment names, repository identifiers, keywords, researcher first and last names, reagents and reagent manufactures, instruments and instrument manufactures, sample annotations and manuscript identifiers. A vector of identifiers of matching datasets is retrieved. NULL is returned if no matching datasets are found.

Usage

```
flowRep.search(query.string)
```

Arguments

query.string The query term used to search FlowRepository datasets for.

Details

An HTTP GET request is sent to FlowRepository to perform the search, this retrieves an XML from FlowRepository, and this XML is parsed to extract the list of identifiers of matching experiments.

Value

A vector of objects of class character containing strings with FlowRepository dataset identifiers available. NULL if no matching datasets were found.

Description

This class represents the metadata (i.e., information about) a dataset stored in FlowRepository.

Details

Objects of class flowRepData can be used to hold information about a FlowRepository dataset. This includes the FlowRepository dataset identifier, name, primary researcher, investigator and uploader, information about the purpose, conclusions, comments and funding, experiment dates, QC measures, MIFlowCyt score, keywords, organizations, publications, list of FCS file names and attachment names, and whether or not it is a public dataset. Using this objects, FCS files and attachments can be easily downloaded to your local file system. See the [download](#) method.

Creating Objects

To create a flowRepData directly from an FlowRepository, use function [flowRep.get](#). This is the recommended and safest way of object creation, since flowRep.get will perform basic quality checks and populate all the slots accordingly. Unless you know exactly what you are doing, creating objects using new or the constructor (as described below) is discouraged.

Slots

- id:** Object of class character containing the FlowRepository identified of the dataset. These identifiers are typically in the form of FR-FCM-xxxx where xxxx represents 4 alphanumeric characters.
- public.url:** Object of class character or NULL containing the public URL of this dataset. This will commonly be in the form of `https://flowrepository.org/id/identifier`, where identifier is the FlowRepository identified of the dataset.
- name:** Object of class character or NULL containing the name of this dataset.
- public:** Object of class logical or NULL containing the information whether this dataset is public.
- primary.researcher:** Object of class character or NULL containing the name of the primary researcher associated with this dataset.
- primary.investigator:** Object of class character or NULL containing the name of the primary investigator associated with this dataset.
- uploader:** Object of class character or NULL containing the name of the uploader of this dataset.
- experiment.dates:** Object of class character or NULL containing the dates associated with this dataset. Typically, there will be two dates associated with the dataset, the first one for the start of the experiment, the second one for the end of the experiment. A single date indicates the start of an experiment that may still be ongoing. The dates shall be encoded as "YYYY-MM-DD".
- purpose:** Object of class character or NULL stating the purpose of this dataset (experiment).
- conclusion:** Object of class character or NULL stating the conclusion associated with this dataset (typically conclusions reached by analyzing the data).
- comments:** Object of class character or NULL stating additional comments associated with this dataset.

funding: Object of class character or NULL stating the funding used to collect the data in this dataset.

qc.measures: Object of class character or NULL stating the quality control measures taken in order to ensure the quality of data in this dataset.

miFlowCyt.score: Object of class numeric or NULL stating the MIFlowCyt compliance score of this experiment. MIFlowCyt is the Minimum Information about a Flow Cytometry Experiment - an ISAC Recommendation listing the minimum information that shall be provided as annotation of flow cytometry datasets. The MIFlowCyt compliance score is a value between 0 and 100 percent indicating the level of compliance with MIFlowCyt. Details about how FlowRepository calculates this score are available here: http://flowrepository.org/quick_start_guide#MIFlowCytScore

keywords: Object of class list (of objects of class character) enumerating keywords associated with this dataset.

publications: Object of class list (of objects of class character) enumerating publications associated with this dataset. Publications are typically listed as "PMID:12345678" or "PMCID:PMC1234567".

organizations: Object of class list of objects of class [flowRepOrganization](#) enumerating organizations associated with this dataset.

fcs.files: Object of class list of objects of class [fcsProxy](#) enumerating FCS files associated with this dataset.

attachments: Object of class list of objects of class [attachmentProxy](#) enumerating attachments associated with this dataset.

See [is.downloaded](#) for details. *Usage:* `is.downloaded(flowRepData)`

id Return the character vector representing the identifier to the FlowRepository dataset. See [id](#) for details. *Usage:* `id(flowRepData)`

fcs.files Return an object of class list of objects of class [fcsProxy](#) enumerating FCS files associated with this dataset.

attachments Return an object of class list of objects of class [attachmentProxy](#) enumerating attachments associated with this dataset.

organizations Return an object of class list of objects of class [flowRepOrganization](#) enumerating organizations associated with this dataset.

Description

This class represents the name and address of an organization associated with a dataset stored in FlowRepository.

Details

Objects of class flowRepOrganization can be used to hold information about an organization that is associated with a FlowRepository dataset. A list of these objects will typically be placed in the organizations slot of a flowRepData object when this is obtained using the flowRep.get function (assuming there are any organizations associated with that dataset).
